WHAT A MONTH!

Did you know...? September is Trails Month! It's also Mental Health Awareness Month! And Census Month, among many other designations (Potatoes! Square Dancing!). Interestingly, the COVID-19 pandemic has brought trails and all kinds of health awareness to the forefront for Potter Township. Over the course of the virus, Rocky Bend Nature Preserve became a hot new destination for visitors from as near as down the road and as far as neighboring counties and states. Families, couples, fishermen and kayakers, hikers and birders descended on our peaceful Raccoon Creek valley to enjoy the beauty and respite of nature, get inspired and restored, and find plenty of social distance.

The sharp increase in visitor traffic has brought expected and unexpected impacts – while we have gained friends for Rocky Bend we also have found it necessary to address rude and illegal behaviors, such as damage to public areas and prohibited camping. With the aid of CARES Act funding and the cooperation of Independence Conservancy, Center Township Police Dept and the PA Game Commission, Potter Township recently hired our first-ever Park Ranger to help keep the Nature Preserve safe for visitors and local residents alike. We are proud to introduce Heidi Krigar to Rocky Bend!

Heidi holds a degree in Parks Management and has extensive experience with the Beaver County Conservation District, where she worked with West Nile Virus Mosquito Control programs and developed educational initiatives for park visitors. A Butler County resident, Heidi enjoys the outdoors by horseback and considers bird hunting with her dog a highlight of the year. She will spend 24-30 hours each week interacting with the public, answering practical questions and offering a history or environmental lesson as opportunity arises. She plans to assist with park maintenance, map key visitor information and, when weather keeps visitors away, she will spend time developing educational and maintenance programs for future use. Her position is temporary, through the end of 2020.

Nature Nasties: Why Knotweed is Not Good

No doubt you've seen that tall, lush, bamboo-looking plant that seems to line every creek bank, fill every roadside ditch or crowd every abandoned place in western Pennsylvania. Chances are, you're looking at Japanese knotweed. Japanese knotweed is considered a noxious weed and an invasive plant by the PA Department of Agriculture.



What is an invasive plant and why is it bad? An invasive plant species like Japanese knotweed is one that evolved elsewhere, in this case Asia, was brought here deliberately and/or by accident, and grew out of control without its homeland competitors and predators to keep it in check. Once an area is overtaken by an invasive, the plants that do belong – the native plants – cannot compete and slowly die out. This upsets nature's balance, depriving wildlife on land and water of food and shelter.

Japanese knotweed seeds – which are forming now on pale yellow sprays of flowers – float downstream and start new patches along waterways. Dense tangles of knotweed are nearly impossible to walk through, but do not hold the soil on a stream bank, leading to erosion and smothering macroinvertebrates, the tiny animals that fish eat.

What can you do about Japanese knotweed? First, learn to identify it. If you have it on your property, control it. Penn State Extension has guidance on what to do: <https://extension.psu.edu/japanese-knotweed>. Share your knowledge and work together with your neighbors. Knotweed doesn't respect property lines.

Some people say nothing can be done to control Japanese knotweed. This isn't true. Patience, persistence and an educated approach will work in the long run. If you don't want to spray the leaves, try this method. Wait until June or July when the canes are very high. Cut the canes off about a foot tall, just below a bulging joint segment. Prepare a one or two-gallon pump-type hand sprayer tank with a solution of half water and half glyphosate concentrate (Roundup). Pump the sprayer up and carefully fill the hollow center of each stem with the solution (see photo). The solution will make its way into the underground rhizomes of the knotweed clump and kill it. You can also do this treatment now, in the fall, but be sure to bag and dispose of all the flowers and seeds. Use an agricultural dye to help you see which stems you have treated. Glyphosate does not persist in the soil, and is safe if used as directed on the label. Good luck!



In this case, green is not good: Japanese knotweed (circled in orange) lines both sides of Raccoon Creek, choking out plants that belong in the landscape, leading to shoreline erosion, muddy water, and loss of food and cover for wildlife.

Knotweed knock-out: knotweed plants shown one month after cutting down the canes and filling the hollow stems with a blue-dyed solution of 50% water and 50% glyphosate concentrate. Rainfall doesn't interfere with this technique. This patch of knotweed is trouble no more.

For twenty years Mike has competently served Potter Township and the Board of Supervisors with sound legal advice and a true concern for the welfare of our community. We are particularly grateful for his assistance in navigating the Shell Cracker Plant project and ensuring that proper steps were taken to secure Potter's future.

Unfortunately, due to unmitigated circumstances, Mike and his partners felt it to be in the best interest of both himself and his law firm to cease representation for Potter Township. It will be a daunting endeavor for the Board to fill this vacancy with another solicitor of equal expertise and proficiency.

I'd like to take this opportunity to thank Mike for his many years of dedicated, professional service to Potter Township and to wish him the best of everything in the future.

ZONING REMINDERS for POTTER TWP RESIDENTS

First of all, thanks so much to so many of you for your compliance and responses to my information requests that I published in the Summer Newsletter. Your responses were greatly appreciated—especially for the receipts for your most recent septic clean out. But, there are more of you that I need to hear from. The response is not yet 100% on the septic clean outs. Remember this is required by Potter Township Ordinance 159-23 which states:

'All septage originating within the Township shall be disposed of in accordance with the requirements of the Pennsylvania Solid Waste Management Act (Act 97 of 1980, 35 P.S. § 6018.101 et seq.) and all other applicable laws and at sites or facilities approved by DEP.'

It's not just us – it's a State mandate & we want to be in compliance... So, please provide your response or proof of compliance to the Township as soon as you can.

Also, a reminder to complete the **RESIDENTIAL RENTERS ANNUAL REPORT FORM** which is available on the Potter Twp website under the 'Resources' tab. PLEASE TAKE SPECIAL NOTICE: Potter Township has adopted an ordinance, identified on our Website in eCode as "Chapter 153: Rental Occupancy Reports". This chapter provides for a reporting procedure of residential rental units, and penalties for failure to so report. If you are currently living in a dwelling that you don't own, and whether it is owned by a third party or a relative, (and whether you pay rent or not) this Ordinance still applies to you. Please fill out this form and mail or drop off at the Municipal Office at 206 W Mowry RD...ASAP...thanks!

Having read this...if you are not an owner, ALSO, please notify your landlord or relative of this requirement. If you are an owner of a rental property, it is your responsibility to provide the annual reporting. Please fill out this form and mail or drop off at the Municipal Office at 206 W Mowry RD...ASAP...thanks!

The Pennsylvania Game Commission has expanded hunting opportunities for the 2020-2021 hunting seasons in the Commonwealth. There will be Sunday hunting opportunities on three days – Sunday, Nov. 15 for archery deer hunting, Sunday, Nov. 22 for bear hunting during the bear firearms season, and Sunday, Nov. 29 for deer hunting during the firearms deer season. For those accustomed to not seeing hunters in the woods on Sunday, this will be a change from past practice. Hikers, bird watchers, and ATV riders are all encouraged to wear some type of fluorescent orange attire when heading into the woods in the fall. This color helps hunters identify and locate those who also use the woods of Pennsylvania for other types of recreation.
